

CITY OF ROYAL CITY COUNCIL MINUTES August 4, 2015

The City Council of the City of Royal City, Grant County, Washington, met in regular session on August 4, 2015. The meeting was called to order at 7:03pm by Mayor Kent Anderson.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Councilmembers Gary Fanning, Hollin Garnick and Tiffany Workinger. A motion was made to <u>excuse Councilmembers Andy Anderson and Hector Rodriguez</u> (m/s Workinger/Fanning) The motion carried.

STAFF PRESENT: City Attorney Katherine Kenison, City Planner Darryl Piercy, Police Chief Darin Smith, Finance Director Greg Pike, Public Works Director John Lasen

PUBLIC COMMENT: Josefina Gonzalez, 307 Calla Street, presented her case for one-time forgiveness related to water overages during months of June/July. One-time forgiveness was granted for the months of June and July for overages only. Resident is still required to pay the base amount.

- Pump/Motor pulled from Well no. 1 to be tested by Pumptech to determine cause of failure.

Planning & Building:

- Potential abatement of Sparks apartments on Acacia street was discussed. To complete an asbestos assessment would cost about \$1,000 per Darryl Piercy. Asbestos removal costs are estimated to be \$20,000 or more.

Legal:

- The Royal City Golf Course would like to apply for a liquor license to operate a snack bar that would serve alcohol. City Attorney Katherine Kenison confirmed that there would be no legal issue for the City related to the Golf Course serving alcohol.
